

Statement of the ECO Secretary General H.E. Amb. Khusrav Noziri at the Ceremony of Proclamation of Shahrisabz City as ECO Tourism Capital for 2024 Shahrisabz, Uzbekistan, April 25-26, 2024

This includes the grand Ak-Saray Palace and the revered Dar-ut-Tilavat Complex, preserving the essence of the Silk Road's cultural legacy. Its breathtaking vistas, as captured by ECO artists in recent Plein Air activities, range from lush valleys to the snow-capped Pamir Mountains, inviting endless adventures.

Famous Uzbek poet Mir Alisher Navai expressed his deep respect and loyalty to Shahrisabz, one of the most ancient and beautiful corners of Māwarā'an-nahr (Transoxiana), the land of great scholars and cities in his works. In particular, in his epic poem "Sab'a-'i Sayyar" ("Seven Planets"), an Egyptian tourist named Saad tells a legend to Sasanid Shah Bahram-i Gor. Saad says that he met two tourists in green clothes during his trip and asked them where they were from and the tourists responded like this:

The unfolding international event in Shahrisabz echoes the above sentiments of Mir Alisher Navai. It promises to celebrate the city's unique identity and the warm hospitality of its people. From cooking competitions to ethno-sport displays and captivating folklore music, this festival will showcase Uzbekistan's rich cultural heritage to visitors from all around.

The Economic Cooperation Organization remains dedicated to fostering regional cooperation and sustainable development across Member States. A key focus is on enhancing tourism, which offers vast potential for economic growth, cultural exchange and social progress.

Since its inception at the 3rd ECO Ministerial Meeting on Tourism in Khujand, Tajikistan in 2019, the annual tradition of ECO Tourism Capital has showcased the diverse cultural heritage and natural beauty of our member countries. This practice underscores our shared commitment to using tourism as a driver for progress and prosperity.

Previous ECO Tourism Capitals like Dushanbe in Tajikistan, Sari and Ardabil in Iran have seen increased visibility and investment, leading to significant socioeconomic advancement. In 2024, Shahrisabz embraces this opportunity for further growth. Looking ahead, Erzurum in Türkiye and Shusha in Azerbaijan are slated for 2025 and 2026, poised to benefit similarly. The tradition of selecting ECO Tourism Capitals is gaining momentum, with Lahore in Pakistan, Marv in Turkmenistan and Karakol in Kyrgyz Republic as potential candidates for 2027. This signals a bright future for sustainable tourism development in the ECO Region
