## Statement by the Deputy Prime Minister of the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan, Abdul Ghani Baradar 17th ECO Summit

Afghanistan is fully committed to eliminating illicit drug production and trafficking. We have entirely banned the cultivation, processing, and smuggling of poppies and narcotics. - Practical work has begun on the **TAPI pipeline** (Turkmenistan–Afghanistan–Pakistan–India), which will serve as a critical energy corridor for the region.
- We express our support for the **North-South Corridor Project**, which promises to strengthen economic and logistical ties across the region.

Afghanistan's geographical position makes it a natural hub for regional cooperation. We encourage all ECO member states to collaborate with a stable, reliable, and cooperative Afghanistan to achieve shared economic goals.

Our priorities include boosting cooperation in:

- Trade and investment
- Energy and transport
- Agriculture and food security

• Environmental protection and climate resilience

We are utilizing our domestic capacities to revive the Afghan economy and call upon ECO member states to invest in promising sectors such as **mining**, **agriculture**, **infrastructure**, **energy**, **telecommunications**, **and healthcare**.

The Islamic Emirate is pursuing a shift from a consumption-based model to a **productive**, **transit-oriented**, **and self-reliant economy**. We believe Afghanistan's active participation is essential for regional economic growth and cooperation.

We urge ECO member states and the international community to engage with Afghanistan **realistically and constructively**—basing relations on mutual respect, practical cooperation, and shared interests.
